4	Institutional Strengthening	
4.1	Development of Centers handed over to KILA (Programmes)	<p>As part of the institution development, Govt. of Kerala merged five institutions with KILA viz. Attappady Hills Area Development Society- Centre for Comprehensive Participatory Resource Management (AHADS-CCPRM), Agali, State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD), Kottarakkara and three Extension Training Centres (ETCs) at Mannuthy, Kottarakkara and Thaliparamba. The centre at Agali is named as KILA Centre for Tribal Development and Natural Resource Management (CTDNRM) and the Centre at Kottarakkara is renamed as Centre for Human Resource Development. ETC Thaliparamba will be the Centre for Organic Agriculture and Waste Management, ETC Mannuthy will be the Centre for Good Governance and ETC Kottarakkara will be the Centre for Socio Economic Development. Institutional and infrastructural development of these centres is one of the major programme of KILA in the ongoing Plan period. Specific programmes will be developed for each of the centres.</p> <p>With the aim to supplement the educational activities, demonstration of various Model Projects will be developed at these different centres of KILA based on the theme of the centre.</p>
4.2	Upgradation of library and e-library and information system development	KILA has a state of the art library with vast collection of books and journals. The focus during the plan period will be to develop KILA library and the library at various centres as the Resource centre on Local Governance and Development with a comprehensive collection of books, publications and documents on the Thematic area, which will be further strengthened as a digital library.
4.3	Faculty and staff Improvement Programme	For regular upgradation of the knowledge and skills of the Faculty of KILA and there by impart quality training, they needs to attend specific programmes of relevance to KILA activities. Being an institute envisaged to develop as a centre of excellence at the national and international levels, it requires the enhancement of the capacities at the supporting staff level too. It is proposed to have provision for such capacity enhancement programmes where they undergo trainings and attend various courses at different levels.
